Program Overview

The 2025 Business Attraction Grant Program is a joint public/private program between the Town of Lisbon and the Lisbon Community Federal Credit Union designed to encourage the relocation and expansion of established businesses from outside of Lisbon to establish operations within the Village District of Lisbon, Maine (see enclosure A). This program aims to stimulate economic growth, enhance community vibrancy, and create job opportunities.

Objectives

1. Support Local Economic Development: Attract established businesses to enhance the local economy.
2. Create Jobs: Foster job creation in the Village District.
3. Promote Community Engagement: Encourage businesses to actively participate in local events and initiatives.

Eligibility Criteria

Established Business: Applicants must own a “for profit business” and must have a proven track record of at least three years of year round operation in another location. Must provide a business plan forecasting the next 3 years.

Relocation/Expansion: Must provide documentation of relocation or expansion plans, to include site location if available, from outside of Lisbon to establish operations within the Village District (see appendix A). Financial Stability: Applicants must demonstrate financial health and sustainability.

Business Type: Priority will be given to businesses that align with the community’s economic development goals and provide essential services or unique offerings. See Appendix C for Town Vision

All applicants must comply with local ordinances and codes requirements throughout the process.

Grant Details

This grant total (\$45,000) is funded by a contribution from the Town of Lisbon Revolving Loan Fund of \$30,000 and a contribution from Lisbon Community Federal Credit Union of \$15,000

This is, assuming conditions are met, a zero match/no repayment grant program. The funds will be distributed to selected businesses until expended, based on the grading matrix attached.

The grading matrix will be applied by a selection committee that is comprised of the following contributors:

Lisbon Economic and Community Development Director

Lisbon Finance Director

Lisbon Community Federal Credit Union Representative

Lisbon Development Committee Representative

The top candidates will be forwarded to the Lisbon Revolving Loan committee for further financial analysis and recommendation to Council.

Categories

There shall be two categories available.

Large Business Category -

Grant Amount: Up to \$20,000

Eligibility: Established companies that are relocating or expanding into the Village District of Lisbon from outside of Lisbon. Businesses in the Large Business Category must employ 11 or more full time employees.

Commitment: Recipients must commit to remaining in the Village District for a minimum of five years if granted the full amount. Commitments for lesser grant amounts will be prorated at 1 year for every \$4,000 granted. Downsizing staff after opening may result in a reduction of grant funding.

Small Business Category -

Grant Amount: Up to \$12,000

Eligibility: Established companies that are relocating or expanding into the Village District of Lisbon from outside of Lisbon. Businesses in the Small Business Category shall employ 10 or fewer full time employees

Commitment: Recipients must commit to remaining in the Village District for a minimum of three years from date of opening if granted the full amount. Commitments for lesser grant amounts will be prorated at 1 year for every \$4,000 granted

Commitment Exemption – Any business that fails to meet the time commitment due to acts of god or other unforeseen external circumstances may file a repayment appeal to the Lisbon Revolving Loan Committee by contacting the Lisbon ECD director. Recommendations of the RLF Committee will be forwarded to Lisbon Town Council for final decision.

Application Process

1. Application Form: Applicants must fully complete a detailed application form including:

- Business name and contact information
- Description of the business and its services/products
- Proposed location of new business
- Plans for relocation or expansion
- Financial statements for the past three years
- Expected economic impact (jobs created, investment amount, etc.)
- Community engagement plan (how the business will endeavor to become part of the community)
- Tax identification information (EIN, Owner SS if DBA)

2. Submission: Applications must be submitted electronically or by mail to the Lisbon Economic Development Office. **Applications open on a rolling basis as long as funds remain available.**

3. Review Process:

- Applications will be reviewed by the selection committee
- The committee will evaluate applications based on eligibility criteria, economic impact, community benefits, and alignment with local development goals.
- Grants may be awarded until the funds have been exhausted for the 2025 grant program.
- Final approval remains with the Town Council and is subject to execution of a grant agreement documenting the conditions of the award.
- Grant applications will be evaluated based on the grading rubric; however, the selection committee has discretion to recommend awards based upon full consideration of all factors, including but not limited to the committee's determination of the most impactful way to allocate limited grant funds. Partial awards may be offered.

4. Award Announcement: Successful applicants will be notified within 30 days of the submission deadline. It is expected that the business will be open within 12 months of receiving their award notice.

Grant Disbursement

- Award recipients will receive ½ of their grant monies in a single payment upon signing a grant agreement that includes the appropriate time commitment to operate in the Village District. Balance of grant dollars to be paid at opening of business.
- Funds must be used for eligible business expenses related to the relocation or expansion, such as:
 - Leasehold improvements
 - Equipment purchases
 - Marketing and promotional activities
 - Hiring and training staff

Reporting and Compliance

- Progress Reports: Grant recipients must submit a 6 month status report detailing progress if not yet open. After opening, an initial report followed by an annual report must be submitted describing business performance, job creation, any support needed to improve and community engagement activities.
- Site Visits: The ECD office may conduct periodic site visits to monitor progress and ensure compliance with grant terms.
- Consequences for Non-Compliance: If a business fails open within 12 month from grant acceptance or fails to meet the applicable period of commitment to remain in business in Lisbon, they will be required to repay a portion of the grant based on the time remaining in the commitment period.

Promotion of the Program

- The program will be promoted through local media, the town's website, social media channels, and business networks to ensure maximum visibility and outreach.

Conclusion

The Business Attraction Grant Program aims to foster a thriving business environment in Lisbon's Village District. By providing financial support and encouraging established companies to relocate or expand, this initiative will contribute to the town's economic vitality and community development.

Village Grant Program District Boundaries

The following properties will be considered eligible for the 2025 Lisbon Village Grant Program.

- All properties with road frontage along Route 196 Between the intersection (southern end) of 196 and Crest Ave and Gartley Street and the intersection (Northern end) of Route 196 and Premier Drive.
- All properties with road frontage on Village St from the intersection (West end) of Route 196 and Village St and the intersection (East End) of Village St and Gartley St
- All properties with road frontage on Memorial Drive from the intersection (West end) of Route 196 and Memorial Drive and the intersection (East End) of Memorial Drive and Spring St. *Property with road frontage on Spring St. is excluded.*
